Thank you for allowing me the opportunity to audit the books of the Grand Secretary and the Grand Treasurer.

I found the books to be in good order, though a few adjustments were needed. The adjustments were as follows:

- 1. An adjustment was made to the Grand Secretary's ledger to reduce a payment from Bethel #12 from \$25.00 to \$23.37, an adjustment of \$1.63, to reflect the actual amount of the check and to balance the deposit as reflected on the bank statement.
- 2. An adjustment was made to the Grand Secretary's ledger to reclassify an entry. The original entry was for \$938.00 to Grand Session Registration. While the payment was for a total of \$938.00, only \$928.00 was for Grand Session Registration and the additional \$10.00 was for Flags and Medallions. The Grand Secretary correctly applied the \$10.00 to Flags and Medallions, but incorrectly applied the adjustment to an expense account. The correct adjustment would be to reduce the income to Grand Session Registration as a deduction so as to not overinflate the organization's income and expenses.
- 3. An adjustment was made to the Grand Secretary's ledger to move the voided checks that had been issued to Grand Lodge and Grand York Rite from newly created account codes to the code the payments had originally been made from.
- 4. An adjustment was made to the Grand Treasurer's ledger of \$84.10 to move expenses from the GG Council Expense category, sub-category Grand Session Expenses, to the Grand Session Expenses category, sub-category Grand Session Expenses. This adjustment aligns all Grand Session expenses within the same accounting codes and balances with the Grand Secretary's ledger.

In auditing income and expenses, after the above adjustments, I found both sets of books to record total income from July 1, 2022 through June 30, 2023 to be \$20,425.68 and total expenses to be \$21,458.00 for a net loss of \$1,032.32 for the year.

I would offer a couple of suggestions for the SD Grand Guardian Council. These suggestions are not recommendations requiring action. However, they are suggestions that would help the Grand Secretary, Grand Treasurer and future Audit Committees to work better together.

- 1. The account structure / chart of accounts should remain balanced between the two sets of books. One officer should not create new account codes unless both officers are in agreement and codes are created across both sets of books.
- 2. The category and account structure should be reviewed and cleaned up. The structure is confusing, with identical account descriptions in multiple categories. The chart of accounts could be greatly simplified, making everyone's jobs easier.

3. Finally, communication between the Treasurer and Secretary is incredibly important. may be helpful if bank statements were shared between both officers so each could reconcile income and expenses against the bank. Adjustment #1 above would have been found by the Grand Secretary through a reconciliation of her books to the account.

Again, I appreciate the opportunity to perform this service for the SD Grand Guardian Council. My commitments elsewhere will prevent me from performing the audit going forward. I wish the organization success in the future.

CAV report

Sept. 29, 2019 was the last training held in SD. As of the March list we currently have 84 trained CAVs plus 5 residing out of state. Since all training is done on line now, I have no idea how many people have taken advantage of the on-line-training.

Virtual Training is the only method of training now. The training staff has been reduced and all of the scheduling for classes is done on line. To sign up for a training class go to: Jobsdaughtersinternational.org, click on the sandwich menu (3 little lines) in the upper right corner, click on **Youth Protection** and then **Class Registration**. Then you may choose your class from the ones listed (be aware of time zones when you choose). Classes are 6 hours long and you must not leave the class.

There has been a problem with people not believing that they are mandatory reporters and therefore not doing their job. This section will be dropped from the actual training and become a separate Mandatory reporting class that will also be a 2 hour class done on line and a certificate will be required to be sent in.

The online renewal will continue as is for now. Eventually my position will be eliminated and everyone will be responsible for their own. The rules stay the same as far as getting renewals in on time. I will continue to send an email reminder to everyone at the beginning of the month 90 days in advance of the renewal date. I have also been sending a reminder at 60 days. If anyone shows up on the list of the month they are due I send a reminder but sometimes it is too late by the time I get the list so it is up to you to pay attention. You should be getting a printable card when you renew. Further down the road all of the reminders will be done automatically.

Report from the Committee on Promotion 2022-2023

The promotions committee met in secret 200 times. The meetings were so secret that none of the members even knew about them. Rumor has it that if we had been there, we would have been sworn to secrecy and that if we revealed any of the happenings; we would suffer a horid and extremely painful death.

We did receive one request for payment from a Bethel for cost to send information to the schools. The amount requested was more than the amount we had in our budget. It was decided at the annual meeting to cover that expense in full.

The Grand Lodge approached us with an idea. At a DeMolay Conclave that was held with members from other jurisdictions, one of the other jurisdictions presented all their new members with a nice backpack. The backpack had the DeMolay logo embroidered on it and contained some DeMolay promotion items as well as their "secret code book." The Grand Lodge put in their proposed budget for 2023-24, \$1,500 for each of the youth organizations within South Dakota. This budget was approved during the 149th Annual Communication of the Grand Lodge of South Dakota.

For us to claim these funds, we will need to have the backpacks completed and then submit the receipt to the Grand Lodge. We are currently looking into which logo to use, the official JDI Logo, with the South Dakota tag line, the more generic SDJD, or one of the other logos out there like the 3 daughters within the triangle. Once we decide that item, it will be time to find that promotional business that will print them for us.

As to what goes into the backpack, it is suggested that we include the following items:

Welcome letter from GG/AGG
Letter with HIKE information
Paper showing the multitude of acronyms that are used by the organization
Jobie keychain
Car decal/window clings
Ritual

The Grand Secretary would purchase paper of different colors, say light purple, green, yellow and white that would only be used for these kits. Whenever a Bethel would have an initiation scheduled, they would request one of these kits from the Grand Secretary. She would then print the letters and put them in the backpack and it would be sent to the Bethel to present at the initiation.
